Parent/Teacher Interviews was a big success. Thank you to everyone who attended the interviews and I want to acknowledge our teachers who put a lot of effort into being very prepared and they were able to share a lot of information about each of their students. School Camps

Behaviour

I have been very unhappy with the rough play and the language some of our Grade 4 boys have been using on the oval this term. 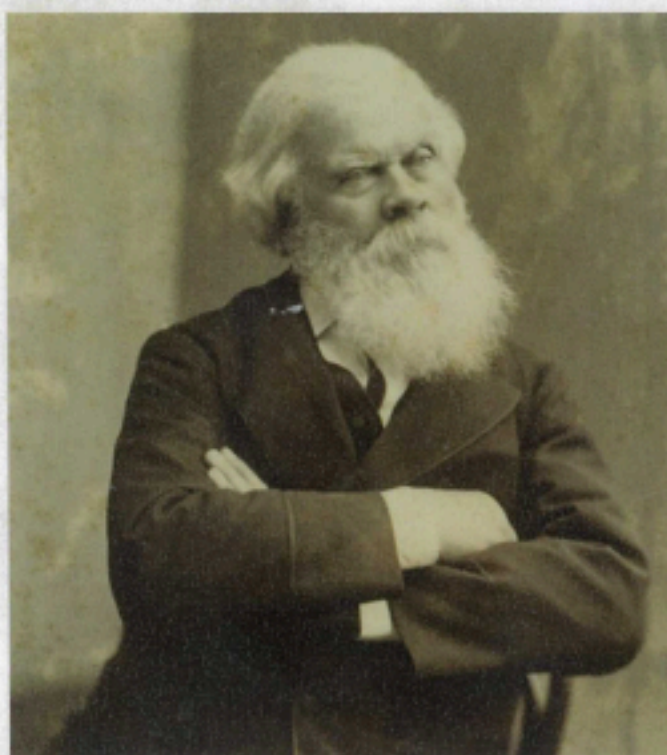

The Three Men Who Made It Happen

Henry Parkes, formally known as Sir Henry Parkes, was the Father Of Federation. He has this noble title because it was his idea for Australia to federate. He made a famous speech in Tenterfield, NSW. This very important speech was called the Tenterfield Address. It was so significant because the government had been talking about it but it was the first mention to the public. What disappoints people is that he died before Australia federated.

Sir Edmund Barton was Australia's first Prime Minister. He attended many conventions about federation.

Barton enjoyed politics and started his career as a barrister. He wanted to be a politician though.

Barton also was a big part of writing Australia's constitution. He believed that the people should have a voice on whether or not to federate and was friends with Henry Parkes when Henry was kicked out of Government.

He then resigned from office after a couple of years.

125th OF FEDERATION! *Anniversary*

FEDERATION (1901)

Can you believe it people? it has been exactly 125 year since Australia, including all six colonies, have declared that they were going to federate, and to this day we are a strong, inclusive country. Federation is a very important year in Australian history. 1901 was the very important year, it was the year we federated, but it could only happen if all the 6 colonies agreed to the idea, as some colonies were more wealthy than the others. The ones that were less wealthy were scared that they wouldn't get a say in anything because there were many bigger colonies. It was a very difficult situation for the politicians at the time .

HENRY PARKES (1815-1895)

Henry Parkes is one of the most important people in the federation history. Not only was he the founder of the federation, but he was also a very successful man. Parks made a very famous speech about federation and that is the reason Australia became a nation. He mentioned in his speech that all colonies don't have one joint railway, and if we were a nation with the same railways it would make it much easier to travel, without getting on different trains. Then sadly poor Parkes died 6 years before Australia finally federated in 1901. Henry Parkes was 80 years of age when he died and lived a pretty good long life.

Australia wouldn't be the nation today without Henry Parkes.



ALFRED DEAKIN (1856-1919)

Alfred Deakin was a very talented journalist and also had a part time job in the political area. He heard Henry Parkes talking about the idea of federation. He was all in on the idea on federation and decided to help Parkes protest. As a man who was born in Melbourne, Victoria, he was a big part of federation! Deakin also helped shape the "White Australia" policy, which is where only white people could live in Australia (which was very unfair) but later got changed so that all people could live in Australia.

EDMUND BARTON (1849-1920)

Edmund Barton was Australia's first Prime Minister and also a strong supporter of Federation, but he also wanted people to have a choice. He was also a very significant man in the process. Barton resigned after a couple of years as prime minister and after served as a senior judge in high court.

FEDERATION

Sir Henry Parkes 1815–1896 was a towering figure in colonial Australia. Known as the Father of Federation for driving the union of Australian colonies. Born into poverty in England, he was a self educated ivory turner who emigrated to NSW in 1839. As a liberal politician journalist and five time Premier of NSW he championed democracy free trade and public education.



Alfred Deakin 1856–1919 was a founding father of Australia serving as the second Prime Minister three times. A brilliant orator and writer he was crucial in uniting the colonies into the Commonwealth of Australia in 1901. He helped establish the High Court, pushed for irrigation and launched the Australian Protectionist Party.

Sir Edmund Toby Barton 1849–1920 was a pivotal leader in the federation movement and Australia's first Prime Minister 1901–1903. A Sydney born lawyer he was the chief drafter of the Australian Constitution and passionately campaigned for uniting the colonies famously coining the phrase a nation for a continent and a continent for a nation.

VOICES OF FEDERATION

HENRY PARKES

Henry Parkes was born on May 27th 1815. He was the first person to think of the whole federation idea, and if it wasn't for him Australia wouldn't be a big country it would just be bits and pieces. Henry Parkes wrote and said a speech talking about federation, building a new national government, and to spark peoples imagination and it was significant. Unfortunately, Henry Parkes died 5 years later in April 27th 1896 at 80 years old before federation actually happened, so he couldn't actually see his idea come to life. It has now been 125 years since federation started.



ALFRED DEAKIN

Alfred Deakin was born in Melbourne, Victoria on the 3rd of August 1856. He was a politician who helped make Australia a unified country. He also served threes terms as prime minister of Australia. Along with Henry Parkes, Deakin thought if i was a great idea to federate and become one whole country. He helped shaped many of Australia's early policies including The White Australia Policy, Compulsory Arbitration, and Protectionism. He died on the 7th of October 1919 at just 63 years old.

EDMUND BARTON

Edmund Barton was born in Sydney, New South Wales on the 18th of January 1849. He was Australia's first prime minister. He was a very strong supporter of federation. He served as a senior judge on the high court of Australia until his death on January 7th 1920.



FASHION FEDERATION

Father Of Federation

Henry Parkes, or known as 'father of federation', was the main producer of federation. He was mainly known for uniting the 6 colonies/states together. He stood up to all the premiers to talk about the federation, governments and the defence force.

He presented it on October 24th, 1889 at the Tenterfields School of Art. Before he became the former premier of New South Wales, he was a former poet that wrote and published poems.



Alfred Deakin

Alfred Deakin is a former politician or was the second prime minister. He was a foundation leader of the Australian federation. After for a few years, he became the second prime minister of Australia.

Before all that, he was an attorney general, or the chief law officer of a state or nation. He shaped many of the commonwealth policies. While Deakin was still a lawyer, he was still stuck to journalism. He wrote anonymous articles about federal policies.



Edmund Barton

Edmund Barton was a statesman who brought the Australian federation era to a successful era. That led him to be the first ever prime minister of Australia and resulting the commonwealth in 1901.

He was inspired by Henry Parkes speech at Tenterfield on 24 October 1889 and by Tasmanian lawyer and politician Andrew Inglis Clark, who believed Federation was the solution to rivalry between the colonies over trade.

At the age of 34, he was actually the youngest speaker of the New South Wales legislative assembly. The Legislative Assembly is the Lower House of parliament in Australian states (such as Victoria, WA, and NSW), responsible for representing the people, making laws, and forming the government.

He worked on federation for 10 years, that is why the federation supporters chose Edmund Barton to be the first prime minister.

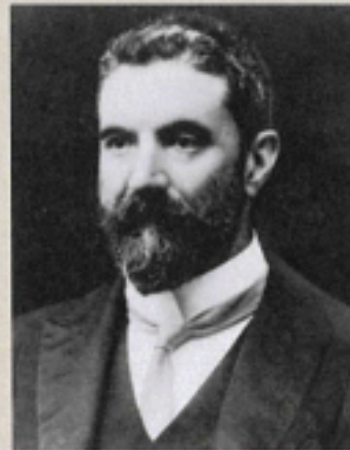

HENRY PARKES

Henry Parkes is well known because he's the first one that said Australia should federate. On October 24, 1889, at the Tenterfeild School of Arts, instead of being 6 separate colonies, he wanted Australia to be together. He passed away on April 27, 1896, 5 years before federation happened.



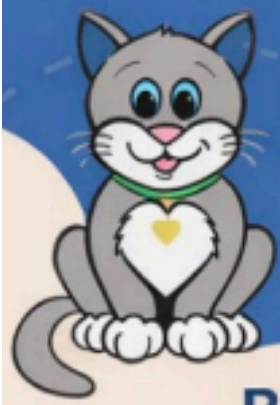
ALFRED DEAKIN

Alfred Deakin was prime minister of Australia 3 times, he was born on August 3, 1856 in Fitzroy, and passed away on October 7, 1919 in Melbourne. He wanted Australia to federate, he was a founding father of federation, his government arranged for the Northern Territory to be moved to the commonwealth control and he supported workers.



EDMUND BARTON

He was prime minister from 1901 to 1903, he gave hundreds of speeches, he led the 1897-1898 convention and he convinced people to vote for federation. He was trained to be a lawyer, but he did politics. He was in the New South Wales parliament for 20 years

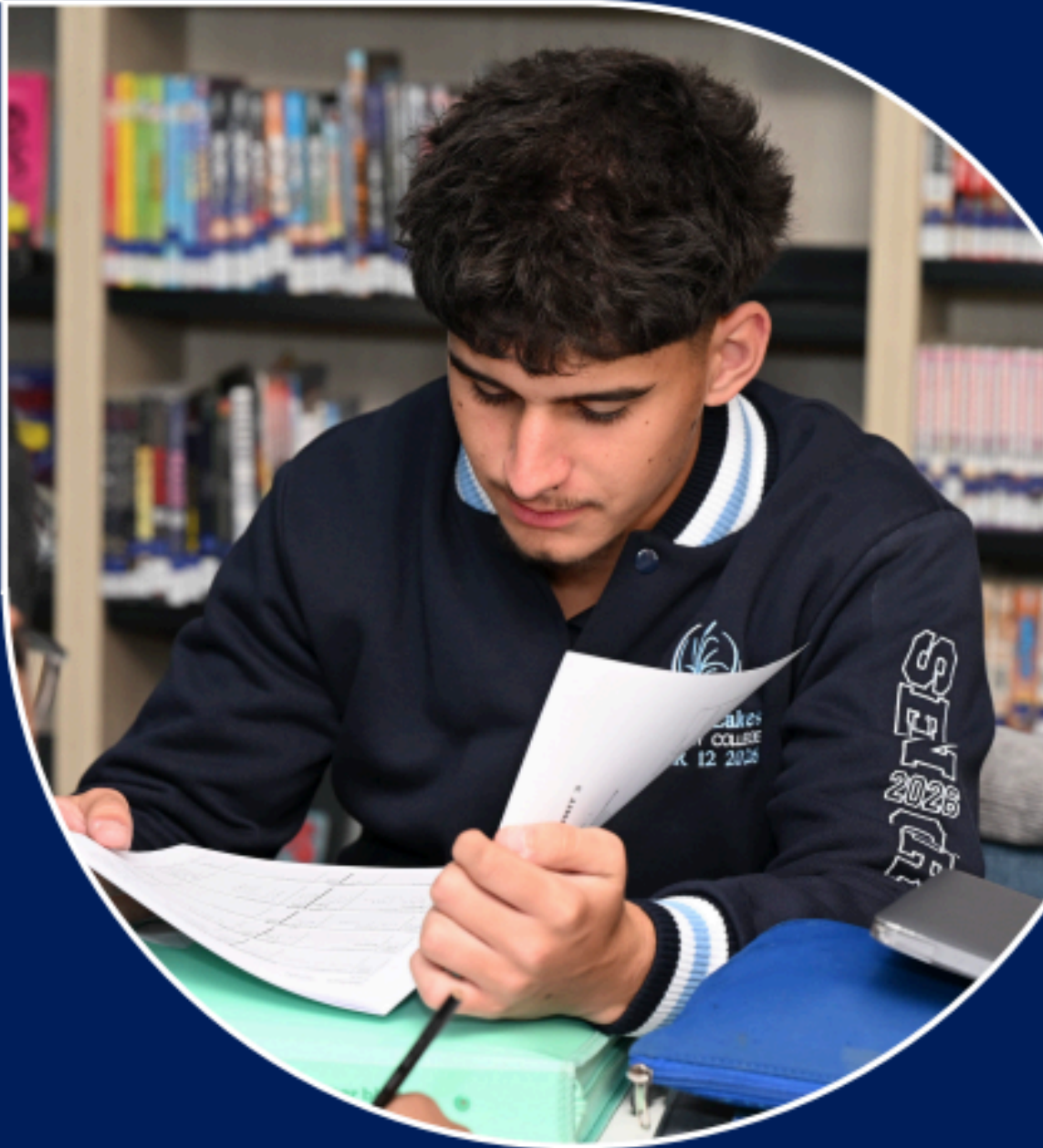

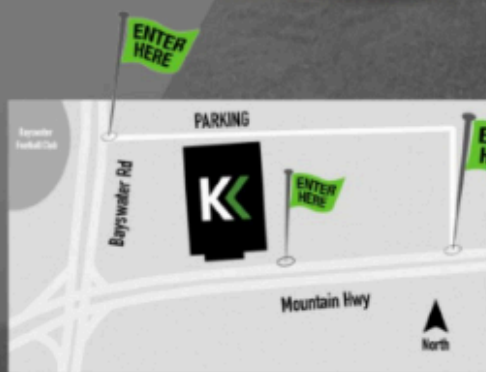
